### Click It or Ticket 2014 Campaign Ends

(ANCHORAGE, Alaska)— Beginning May 19 the Alaska State Troopers, Alaska Wildlife Troopers and local law enforcement officers were out contacting motorists demonstrating poor driving behaviors such as speeding, aggressive and distracted driving, passing in no passing zones and erratic driving, to name a few.

During the CIOT enforcement through June 1st, Troopers took the following actions:

- 43 misdemeanor DUI arrests, 6 felony DUI arrests
- 45 drivers charged with driving with a suspended or revoked license
- 429 additional drivers contacted who were reported as REDDI reports and ultimately determined not to be DUI
- 54 damage only crashes, 11 injury crashes and 1 fatal collision were investigated
- Of the 1766 citations issued, 751 were issued for speeding and 226 were issued for seatbelt or other occupant restraint violations

If you are in a vehicle, you should always wear your seat belt and encourage those around you to do the same. Children in vehicles should be properly restrained using the [appropriate safety equipment](#), whether it is a seat belt, a booster seat or a car seat. The Click it or Ticket special enforcement campaign ended today. Troopers always encourage motorists to practice safe driving behaviors on the roads while traveling to and from your destination.
