ACCUSATION

Jack W. Wray, Administrator of the Alaska Police
Standards Council of the State of Alaska, moves to revoke the certificate of Eddie L. West, as a police officer pursuant to AS 18.65.240(a)(2), AS 18.65.240(c), AS 18.65.270, AS 44.62.330 et. seq., 13 AAC 85.010(a)(3), 13 AAC 85.110(a)(2) and 13 AAC 85.110(a)(3).

The Administrator alleges as follows:

- On or about February 22, 1983, respondent was hired as a police officer for the Anchorage Police Department.
- On or about July 19, 1984, respondent submitted an application to the Alaska Police Standards Council (APSC) for a police officer certificate.
- On or about July 20, 1984, respondent was certified as a police officer in the State of Alaska.
- 4. On or about August 22, 1986, respondent was involved in a high speed pursuit through downtown Anchorage at speeds of 90 miles per hour. Due to the substantial risk to the public from the speeds involved in the chase, a force review board required respondent to review the Anchorage Police Department pursuit policy.

5. On or about September 15, 1986, respondent was disciplined by the Anchorage Police Department and suspended for
one day without pay. The discipline was imposed because
respondent pursued a traffic violator in his personal vehicle.

- 6. On or about July 1, 1987, respondent was disciplined by the Anchorage Police Department and received a written reprimand. The discipline was imposed because respondent was involved in an avoidable accident while attempting to stop a traffic violator by using emergency lights only.
- 7. On or about April 12, 1988, respondent was disciplined by the Anchorage Police Department, suspended for one day without pay, and required to review the Anchorage Police Department procedures related to the operation of emergency vehicles. The discipline was imposed because respondent violated the Anchorage Police Department's emergency driving policy and was involved in an accident.
- 8. On or about December 12, 1988, respondent was disciplined by the Anchorage Police Department and suspended for
 two days without pay. The discipline was imposed because
 respondent ignored a direct order to discontinue pursuit of a
 stolen vehicle.
- 9. On or about June 10, 1989, respondent while pursuing a stolen vehicle once again refused to obey an order by a superior officer to discontinue a pursuit, and created a danger to the public and other officers by continuing the pursuit.

- 10. On or about July 24, 1989, a general review board of management and supervisory personnel of the Anchorage Police department recommended that respondents employment be terminated.
- 11. On or about August 1, 1989, respondent was discharged for cause from his employment as a police officer for the Anchorage Police Department.

Count I

12. Paragraphs 1 through 11 are incorporated by reference as though set forth in detail. In addition, the Administrator alleges that the conduct described in paragraphs 4 - 9 demonstrates that respondent lacks good moral character.

Respondent therefore does not meet the minimum standards for a certified police officer established under AS 18.65.240(a)(2), 13 AAC 85.010(a)(3), and 13 AAC 85.110(a)(3), and his police officer certificate should be revoked.

Count II

13. Paragraphs 1 through 11 are incorporated by reference as though set forth in detail. In addition, the Administrator alleges that respondent was discharged, for cause, from employment as a police officer in Alaska, and therefore, his police officer certificate should be revoked under AS 18.65.240(a)(2) and 13 AAC 85.110(a)(2).

Wherefore, the Administrator prays that Eddie L. West's certificate as a police officer in the State of Alaska be revoked.
