CONSENT AGREEMENT
DECISION AND ORDER

CONSENT AGREEMENT

In the interest of a prompt and speedy settlement of the above-captioned matter, consistent with the public interest, statutory requirements and the responsibilities of the Alaska Police Standards Council, and pursuant to AS 18.65.220, AS18.65.242, 13 AAC 85.100, and 13 AAC 85.260, the undersigned parties enter into this Consent Agreement as a final disposition of this matter.

1. Respondent, David M. Cox, without admitting any allegations that may have been made against him/her, hereby is permanently disqualified for certification as an Alaska police/probation/parole/correctional or municipal correctional officer:

2. Respondent waives his/her right to a hearing and waives the requirement of Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law for the Decision and Order below to be effective and final:

3. Respondent waives any appeal or judicial review of the action agreed to herein:


4. Respondent and the Alaska Police Standards Council agree that this voluntary disqualification of certification shall permanently bar Respondent from working as a police/probation/parole/correctional or municipal correctional officer in Alaska pursuant to 13 AAC 85.010, 13 AAC 85.210, 13 AAC 85.215, and/or 13 AAC 89.010, but this agreement shall have no effect upon any certification other than certification as a police/probation/parole/correctional or municipal correctional officer:

5. Notwithstanding Paragraph 4, Respondent and the Alaska Police Standards

Council agree that Respondent shall retain his right to petition the Alaska Police Standards Council for discretionary rescission of the disqualification, as provided in 13 AAC 85.100(d).


6. Respondent understands that he has the right to consult with and be represented by an attorney concerning this Agreement and any potential Alaska Police Standards Council proceedings. Respondent agrees that this Agreement was not signed under duress and that he has had adequate time to consult with counsel or other persons of his/her choosing;

7. Respondent understands that the public records law and open meetings law apply to the Alaska Police Standards Council. Nothing in this agreement shall be interpreted to accord more secrecy to the records of the Alaska Police Standards Council beyond the confidentiality that is already required by law.
