Wray, Administrator of the Alaska Police Standards Council of 8 the State of Alaska, moves to revoke the certificate of Jay E. Hatfield as 9 a police officer pursuant to AS 18.65.240(a)(2), AS 18.65.240(c), 10 AS 18.65.270, AS 44.62.330 et.seq., 13 AAC 85.010(a)(3), 13 AAC 85.010(b)(1), 13 AAC 85.010(b)(4)(B) and (C), 13 AAC 85.110(a)(1),(2), 11 12 and (3), and 13 AAC 85.110(b)(1). 13 The Administrator alleges as follows: 14 1. On or about July 22, 1984, respondent was hired as a public 15 safety officer by the Unalaska Department of Public Safety. 16 2. On or about July 31, 1984, respondent submitted a signed and 17 notarized Personal History Statement on a form supplied by the Alaska 18 Police Standards Council. The form was signed by respondent on July 27, 19 1984. In response to a question on this form about drug usage, respondent 20 claimed to have used marijuana 5 to 6 times ending in October 1977. 21 3. On or about August 5, 1985, respondent submitted an application 22 to the Alaska Police Standards Council for a police officer certificate. 23 4. On or about August 8, 1985, respondent was certified as a police 24 officer in the State of Alaska. 25 5. On May 13, 1988, respondent submitted to a polygraph examination 26 conducted by Sgt. Gerald Smith of the Alaska State Troopers. Buring the 27 course of the polygraph examination, respondent stated that he had used

marijuana 250 times ending in 1984, cocaine 30 times ending in 1982, opium two times ending in 1980, speed 10 times ending in 1978, and mescaline one 30 time in 1975.

31 6. On or about September 30, 1988, respondent resigned his 32 employment as a public safety officer for the Unalaska Department of Public Safety.

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7. On or about October 12, 1988, respondent was hired as a police officer for the Cordova Police Department.

8. On or about October 31, 1988, respondent submitted a signed and
notarized Personal History Statement on a form supplied by the Alaska
Police Standards Council. The form was signed by respondent on October
21, 1988. In response to a question on this form about drug usage,
respondent claimed to have used marijuana 100 times ending in 1984,
cocaine 25 times ending in 1983, opium two times ending in 1980, and
mescaline one time in 1980.

9. On January 12, 1989, in a statement to Chief Donald P. Yerrick of
the Cordova Police Department, respondent admitted that he had lied about
the extent of his drug usage on the 1984 Personal History Statement.

10. On or about February 4, 1989, respondent resigned his employment
 as a police officer for the Cordova Police Department under threat of
 discharge for cause.

16 11. On or about June 2, 1989, in case number 3AN-S89-3889, the
17 District Attorney in the Third Judicial District filed an information
18 charging respondent with Attempted Perjury in violation of AS 11.56.200(a)
19 and AS 11.31.100(a). The information charged that the respondent
20 unlawfully attempted to make a false sworn statement regarding his use of
21 illicit drugs in an application for employment with the Unalaska Police
22 Department.

12. On or about July 25, 1989, respondent entered a plea of no
contest to the charges filed in the information.

²⁵ 13. On or about September 29, 1989, an Order Suspending Imposition of
 ²⁶ Sentence and providing for probation was entered by Superior Court Judge
 ²⁷ Karl S. Johnstone convicting respondent of Attempted Perjury, a class C
 ²⁸ felony offense. Respondent was sentenced to 6 months probation and a fine
 ²⁹ of \$1000.00.

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3 14. Paragraphs 1 through 13 are incorporated by reference as though In addition, the Administrator alleges that set forth in detail. respondent falsified or omitted information required to be provided on a document supporting an application for police officer certification, and therefore his police officer certificate should be revoked under 8 AS 18.65.240(a)(2), and 13 AAC 85.110(a)(1).

COUNT 1

COUNT II

15. Paragraphs 1 through 13 are incorporated by reference as though set forth in detail. In addition, the Administrator alleges that respondent resigned under threat of discharge, for cause, from employment as a police officer in Alaska, and therefore his police officer certificate should be revoked under AS 18.65.240(a)(2), and 13 AAC 85.110(a)(2).

COUNT III

21 16. Paragraphs 1 through 13 are incorporated by reference as though set forth in detail. In addition, the Administrator alleges that the charges set forth in paragraph 11 demonstrates that respondent lacks good 24 moral character. Respondent therefore does not meet the minimum standards for a certified police officer established under AS 18.65.240(a)(2), 13 AAC 26 85.010 (a)(3), and 13 AAC 85.110(a)(3) and his police officer certificate should be revoked.

COUNT IV

30 17. Paragraphs 1 through 13 are incorporated by reference as though 31 set forth in detail. In addition, the Administrator alleges that 32 respondent repeatedly used a controlled substance other than marijuana

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¹ before application for hire as a police officer. Respondent therefore
 ² does not meet the minimum standards for a certified police officer
 ³ established under AS 18.65.240(a)(2), 13 AAC 85.010(b)(4)(B), and
 ⁴ 13 AAC 85.110(a)(3) and his police officer certificate should be revoked.

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COUNT V

18. Paragraphs 1 through 13 are incorporated by reference as though set forth in detail. In addition, the Administrator alleges that respondent, within the three years before application for hire as a police officer in Unalaska, engaged in the sustained regular use of marijuana. Respondent therefore does not meet the minimum standards for a certified police officer established under AS 18.65.240(a)(2), 13 AAC 85.010(b)(4)(C), and 13 AAC 85.110(a)(3) and his police officer certificate should be revoked.

COUNT VI

19. Paragraphs 1 through 13 are incorporated by reference as though set forth in detail. In addition, the Administrator alleges that under AS 18.65.240(a)(2), and 13 AAC 85.110(b)(1), respondent's police officer certificate must be revoked because the respondent after hire as a police officer has been convicted of a felony.

Wherefore, the Administrator prays that Jay E. Hatfield's certificate as a police officer in the State of Alaska be revoked.
